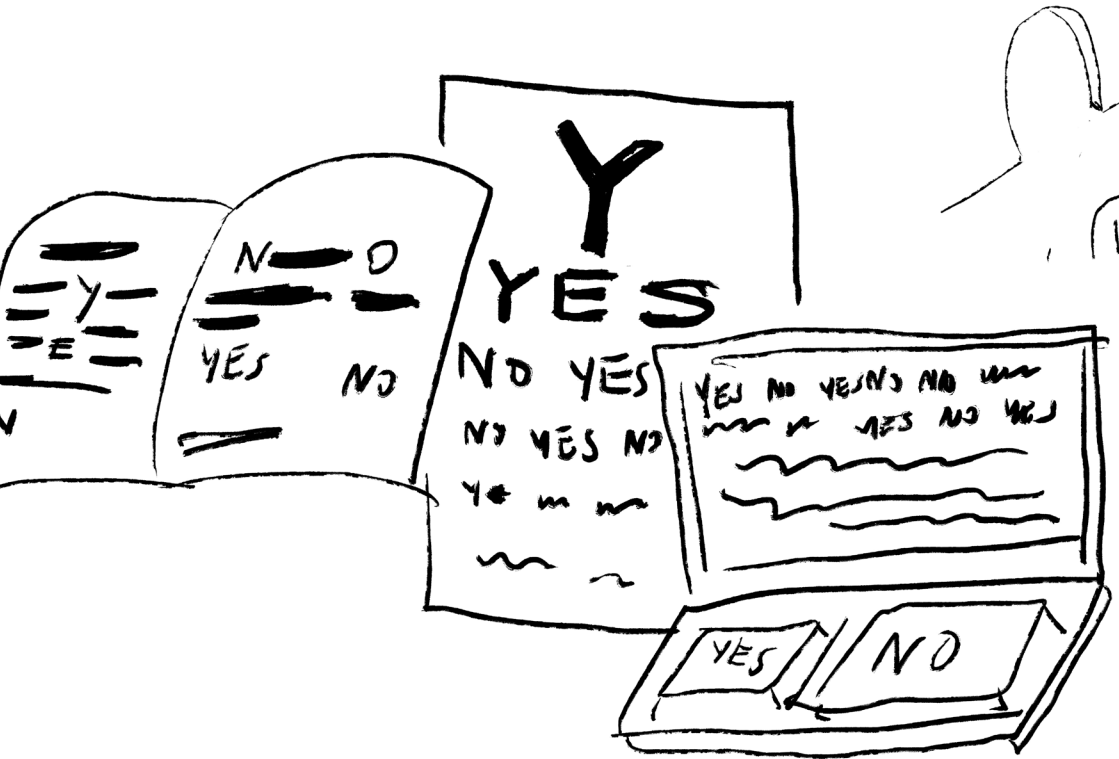


"Answer yes or no only, understand?"

Option 1 — Absurdist objects

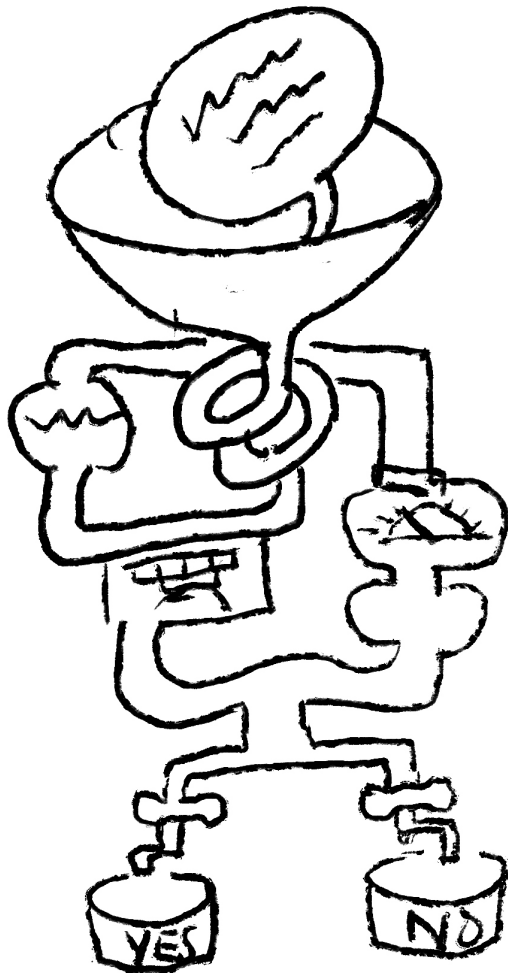
Montage of different everyday elements with a twist — a book or newspaper page with words blacked out but only the letters "Y E S" or "N O" / or only containing YES and NO's. A computer keyboard, a mobile phone, a typewriter with only two buttons. An eye test chart with only YES and NO words. Suggesting the removal of all other narratives.

Option 2 — Distilled information

A drawing of a laboratory / scientific machine
that is processing / distilling information into the
binary YES and NO.

Option 3 — Reverse loudspeaker

Drawing of a person talking enthusiastically in a "reversed loudspeaker" that simplifies or "quietens" the information. (or drawing can be abstract — someone talking with a lot of soundwaves but then it goes through a filter which distills the soundwaves into only ticks and crosses (yes and no).

Option 4 — Reassembling speech

Speech bubbles rearranged into a simple "NO".
